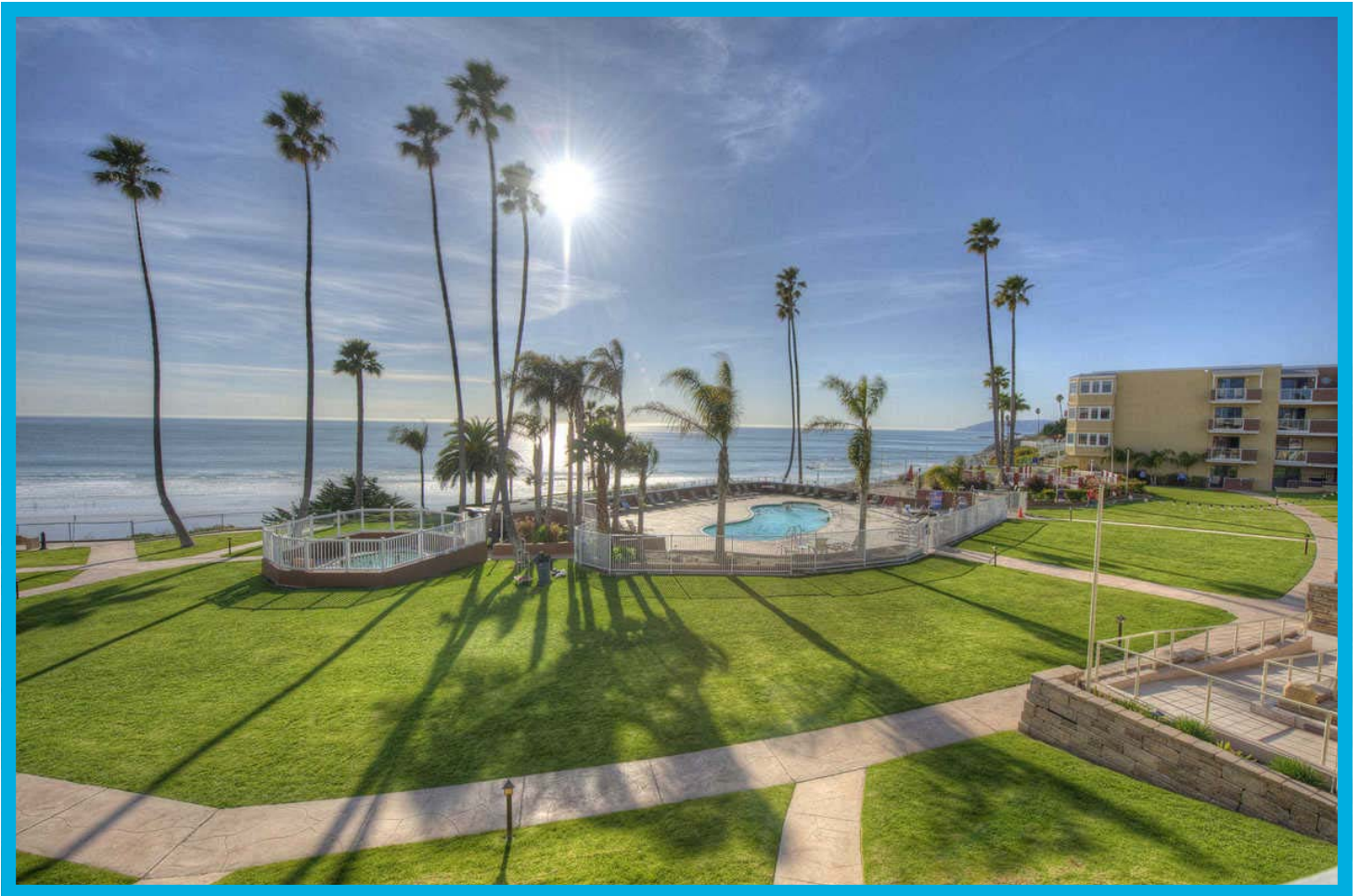

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15

- **11:30am-12:45pm** *Legislative/Regulatory Roundtable Lunch*
Over lunch, Dan Keppen (Family Farm Alliance), John Farner (Netafim USA), and Mike Wade (California Farm Water Coalition) will discuss state and federal legislation, new and changing regulations, the drought, ag communications/outreach, climate change, and global trends in carbon, water, and other issues as relates to irrigated agriculture.
- **1:00pm-4:00pm** *CAIA Innovation/Educational/Technical Sessions*
Fadi Safadi (President, Visual Impact Technologies): Secure Apps and Software for the Ag Space: What is available and what role technology plays within the industry. Mr. Safadi has developed innovative tools such as Toro AquaFlow, Drip Wizard, Netafim crop planning, Mazzei injector selector, INMP (nitrogen management) forms and compliance, field mapping, and tools for cybersecurity.
Chuck Bates (Vice President Products & Agronomy, Netafim USA): Circularity and the recycling of agricultural driplines — examples from other industries, and the mindset shift currently happening in the United States irrigation industry.
John Bourne (Vice President Marketing, Ceres Imaging): Low hanging fruit- the surprisingly huge impact of irrigation issues in drip systems. Clogs and leaks, pest and pressure issues. As everyone who uses drip irrigation knows, there's a lot that can go wrong with your irrigation set. But what is the real cost of this on yield, water usage, quality, and ultimately your bottom line? Ceres Imaging reviewed anonymized data from more than 700,000 acres of drip-irrigated specialty crops across California collected over the course of the 2020 growing season and will share the results of their analysis that quantifies the impact of irrigation issues at a farm level as well as regional and state levels.
Don Cameron (Vice President and General Manager, Terranova Ranch, Inc.): Drip irrigation isn't the only practice that makes Cameron a pioneer in water use efficiency. During flood periods, which typically occur once every three or four years, he captures flood flows from the Kings River and diverts them to his vineyards to recharge the groundwater supply.
Franklin Gaudi (Ed.D. at Cal Poly's Irrigation Training and Research Center): Fertigation Series. The ITRC has created several videos of basic fertigation principles. These videos are available for free via YouTube. The video links will be provided and aspects of the videos will be presented. A digital copy of the Fertigation book will also be provided to those in attendance. Funding for these videos was provided by CDFA and FREP.

- **12Noon-4:30pm** *Tour of Santa Maria Substrate Hydroponic Strawberry Farm and Wine Tasting at Peacock Cellars in Arroyo Grande*

With over 36,000 acres planted this year, strawberries are among California's largest produced agriculture commodities. Traditionally grown on a raised shaped bed covered in plastic mulch, the increasing labor, pesticide, and water use restrictions are leaning growers towards alternative growing practices. The hydroponic table-top strawberry farm showcases reverse osmosis water treatment, automated fertilizer injection via EC and pH control, and fully automated irrigation. Table-top growing provides potential for automated harvesting and the semi-closed environment allows for growing in areas otherwise not acceptable for fresh strawberries.

Next stop of the tour is wine tasting at **Peacock Cellars**. Peacock Cellars is owned and operated by Logan Nichols, his wife Jessica and their family. After studying ag business at Cal Poly where Logan and Jessica met, they set forth to create a niche on the Central Coast, farming tomatoes, and growing wine grapes, including Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Sangiovese, Tempranillo, and Barbera. The Nichols' have created a boutique winery that specializes in small quantities of exceptional wine and are excited to be one of the few wineries whose Winemaker is also the Grower and Owner.
